Beaumont Hospital

Beaumont Hospital is a major academic teaching hospital. It is the second largest hospital in the Republic of Ireland and the principal teaching hospital for the medical school of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland. Beaumont Hospital is the National Centre for Neurosurgery, Renal Transplantation, Cochlear Transplantation and Alpha 1 Antitrypsin deficiency. There are multiple supra-regional specialities and secondary care services provided for the catchment area. Beaumont is designated as a supra-regional cancer and radiotherapy centre.

RCSI Student Attachments:

- Intermediate Cycle 1 & 2 - systems based modular programme delivered for two semesters between the Hospital Education Centre (including library) and the RCSI Education & Research Centre (ERC). Clinical departments delivering this programme include – Medicine, Surgery, Microbiology, Pathology, Forensic Medicine and Tropical Medicine
- Intermediate Cycle 3 – team attachments to general medical and surgical teams, advanced clinical skills programme and student selected component which is administered from the ERC at Beaumont
- Senior Cycle 1 – attachments to the Psychiatry, Medicine, Surgery, Otolaryngology and Ophthalmology services
- Senior Cycle 2 – attachments to general medical and surgical teams and attachments as sub-interns to all general services



Teaching Staff:

Departments based at Beaumont include, Medicine, Surgery, Anaesthesia, Otolaryngology and Psychiatry. The complement includes Heads of Department, Associate Professors, Senior Lecturers, Lecturers, Clinical Tutors and administrative staff. The clinical course is co-ordinated from the Faculty Centre in the ERC, Beaumont.

Getting there:

Beaumont Hospital is on Beaumont Road in Beaumont, Dublin 9, Ireland. Located about 10 kilometres from the city Centre there are plenty of bus routes and transport links available. Go to www.dublinbus.ie for timetables.

Parking is available but you need to get there early - payment is required for all parking facilities.

Connolly Hospital

Connolly Hospital is a major academic teaching hospital providing a range of services – acute medical & surgical services, acute psychiatric services, long stay care, day-care, outpatient, emergency services, diagnostic and support services to the local catchment area.

Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital (OLLHD) is a general acute hospital for the catchment area of Louth, Meath and North Dublin.

The range of acute services includes acute medical & surgical subspecialty services, obstetrics & gynaecology services, paediatrics including neonatal services. In addition, a number of regional services are based at Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital as follows: regional centre symptomatic breast service, emergency medicine – trauma centre and palliative care.

UHW is one of the eight cancer centres of the [HSE National Cancer Control Programme \(NCCP\)](#) and one of two centres in the HSE South Network.

It is Ireland's largest paediatric hospital and is responsible for the provision of the majority of tertiary care service for children including the national centre for cardiac surgery and haematology/oncology, major burns, medical genetics and medical research for childhood illnesses.
